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## Erratum

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In “When to defend: antipredator defenses and the predation sequence” (*American Naturalist* 183:847–855), the first paragraph of the “Mathematical Models” section on page 848 contains several errors—in particular, a misplaced parenthesis—that were introduced after proofs. The paragraph should read as follows:

“Consider a predation sequence in which the predator encounters a prey individual, attacks the prey with probability  $P(\text{attack}) = P$ , and then ingests the prey with probability  $P(\text{ingestion}|\text{attack}) = Q$ . The probability that the predator attacks and ingests the prey ( $P[\text{attack} \cap \text{ingestion}]$ ) is  $P \cdot Q$ , the probability that the predator does not attack is  $(1 - P)$ , and the probability that the predator attacks but is unable to ingest the prey is  $P \cdot (1 - Q)$ ; these are the three mutually exclusive outcomes of the predation sequence we consider.”
