## How to get to the hotel

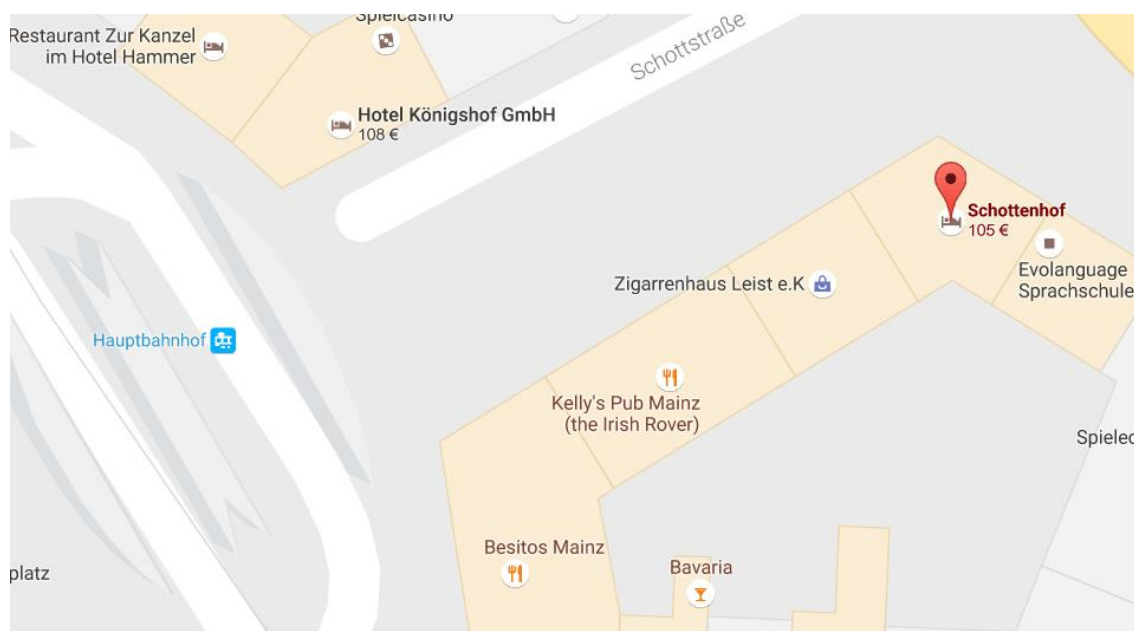
### From Frankfurt Airport to Mainz Central Station

For those arriving by plane, from Frankfurt Airport you can take the S-Bahn (suburban train S8), “Regionalbahn” (RB) or “Regionalexpress” (RE) to Mainz Central Station. All trains to Mainz leave from platform 3. To find the platform, please follow the signs „Regionalbahnhof“(Regional Station). Do not forget to purchase a ticket beforehand. Ticket machines are located on the ground floor and accept cash and major credit cards (an additional fee is charged).

### From Mainz Central Station to the hotel

The hotel Schottenhof is very close to the Central Station (Hauptbahnhof). Leaving Central Station in direction of the city center you’ll find it on the right hand side of Schottstraße. The reception desk is occupied 24/7. Rooms are reserved in your name and will be paid directly by us.

## How to get to the workshop venue

You can take different buses from Mainz Hauptbahnhof to the university. The buses 6, 69, 54, 55, 56, and 57 all go directly to the university. Make sure you leave from platform F “Bussteig F”. Please purchase a short-distance ticket (“Kurzstrecken-Ticket”) from the driver. Leave the bus at bus stop “Universität” and enter the campus through the main entrance (“Forum universitatis”). Go straight until you find the Faculty of Social Sciences, Media and Sports (Georg-Forster-Gebäude, Jakob-Welder-Weg 12). The workshop takes place on the fourth floor of the building.
