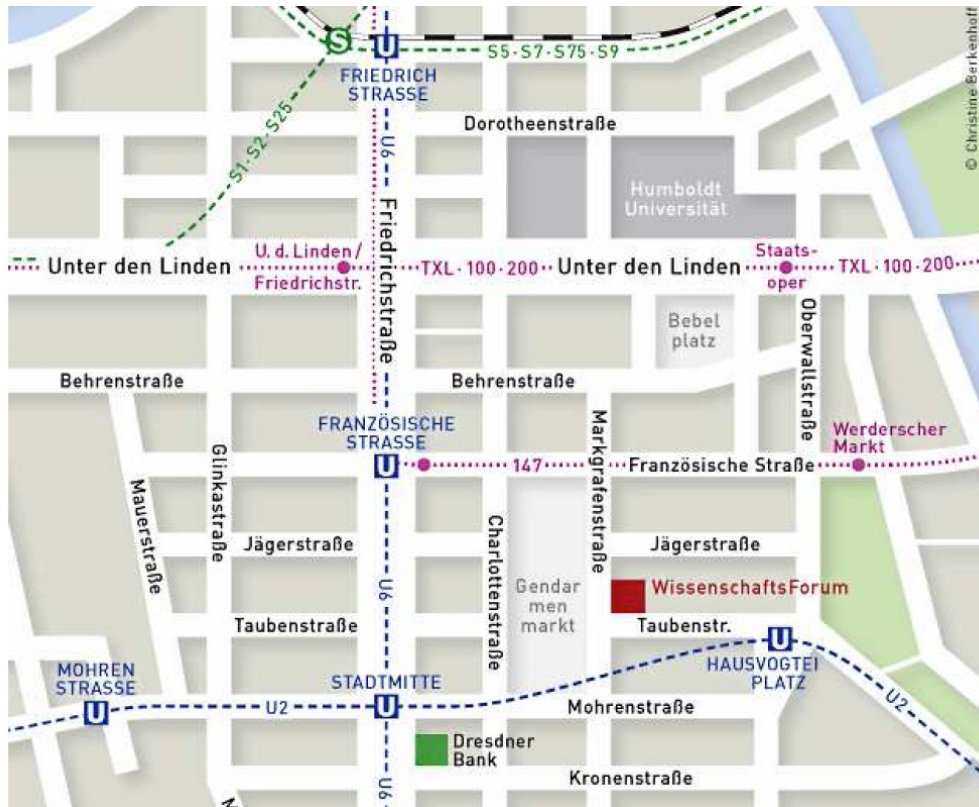

From SCHÖNEFELD airport:

- **S9** to 'Alexanderplatz', then **U2** direction to 'Ruhleben', get off at 'Hausvogteiplatz'. (Duration: about 60 min.)

From TEGEL airport:

- **ExpressBus TXL** until 'Unter den Linden/Friedrichstrasse', then walk up Friedrichstrasse until 'Gendarmenmarkt' (Duration: about 50– 60 min.)

- **Bus 128** direction to 'Osloerstraße' until 'Kurt-Schumacher-Platz', then **U6** direction to Alt-Mariendorf until 'Französische Strasse' (Duration: about 40 min.)

- **Bus 109** or **X9** direction to 'Zoologischer Garten', then **U2** Richtung Pankow until 'Hausvogteiplatz'. (Duration: about 40 – 45 min.)

From Berlin Hauptbahnhof:

S5, S7, S9 or **S75** until 'Friedrichstrasse', then walk up Friedrichstrasse. At 'Friedrichstrasse', you may as well change to **U6** direction to Alt-Mariendorf until 'Französische' (Duration: about 10 min.)
